Sub: Participation of Vigilance Officers in decision making processes having vigilance sensitivity.

It has been noticed that references are being made to this Department for giving opinion in the matters of tender processing etc. In this regard, the attention of all Heads of Departments is drawn to the fact that the C.V.C., in terms of Para 2.9 of the Vigilance Manual, has barred participation of vigilance officers in the decision making or close association in such matters over which they might be required to sit in judgment from vigilance point of view at a later stage. The vigilance officers cannot be party to processing and decision making processes or similar other administrative transactions which are likely to have vigilance sensitivity.

In light of the C.V.C.'s instructions, such matters should not be referred to this Department for giving opinion during processing/decision making processes.
