# 6. PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS

## A. Cargo Traffic

- ➤ During April-May 2015, Kolkata Port handled a traffic of 8.310 million tonnes (mt) of traffic (KDS-2.499 mt, HDC- 5.811mt) against 6.694 mt (KDS-2.243 mt, HDC- 4.451mt) handled during April-May 2014, i.e. a commendable rise of 1.616 mt (24.14%) vis-a-vis 5.28% growth registered by Indian Major Ports during the same period.
- ➤ KoPT registered growth during April-May 2015 vis-a-vis April-May 2014 in respect of quite a number of commodities i.e. POL (Product), LPG, Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid Cargo, Fertiliser, Sulphur, Limestone, Thermal Coal, Coking Coal, Petroleum Coke, Other Coal/Coke, Iron & Steel, Other General Cargo, IVW/IWAI Traffic as well as Container TEUs & Tonnage.
- ➤ Growth was registered at KDS, during April-May 2015 in comparison to April-May 2014, for Vegetable Oil, Petroleum Coke, Other Coal/Coke, Iron & Steel, Other General Cargo, IVW Traffic and Container TEUs & Tonnage. Limestone and Coking Coal materialized in April-May 2015 against no such cargo in the corresponding period of previous year.
- ➤ At HDC, traffic increased in April-May 2015 vis-à-vis April-May 2014 primarily for POL (Product), LPG, Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid, Fertiliser, Sulphur, Limestone, Thermal Coal, Coking Coal, Petroleum Coke, Other Coal/Coke, Iron & Steel and IWAI Traffic.

#### B. Container Traffic

➤ Kolkata Port handled 96,017 TEUs in April-May 2015 against 93,229 TEUs in April-May 2014 recording a growth of 2.99%. KDS handled 81,714 TEUs during April-May 2015 against 77,069 TEUs in April-May 2014 achieving 6.03% rise against 4.34% growth recorded by all Major Ports.

#### C. Comparative Performance

➤ KoPT ranked Third in Coking Coal handling during April-May 2015 and recorded highest growth of 72% vis-a-vis April-May 2014 amongst Indian Major Ports.

#### D. Ship Traffic

In April-May 2015, KoPT handled 629 ships - the highest among Indian Major Ports.

## E. Railway Traffic:

- ➤ During Apr-May'15, KoPT handled rail-borne traffic of 4.51 mt (KDS 0.83 mt, HDC 3.68 mt) against 3.99 mt (KDS-0.85 mt, HDC-3.14 mt) in Apr-May'14 i.e. a rise of 0.52 mt (13.03%).
- ➤ At KDS, number of **trains received** and **despatched in** May'15 was **119** and **103**, respectively and at HDC, **421 trains** were received and **417 trains** were despatched in May'15.
