II. <u>CARGO THROUGHPUT</u>:

- SMP, Kolkata handled 20.651 million tonnes (mt) of traffic during April- August 2020 vis-à-vis 27.078 mt during April-August 2019, registering a fall of 23.74% due to the serial Lockdowns of varying intensities, continuing in the aftermath of the outbreak of Pandemic COVID 19. With 60% of international trade through SMP, Kolkata, getting routed from/to China and other South-East Asian countries, the serial lockdowns had an adverse effect in the traffic downturn experienced at the port. However, Iron Ore & Steel exports, LPG, etc. through HDC have been showing an increasing trend even in the aftermath of Lockdown.
- ➤ HDC handled 15.621 mt of cargo in April-August 2020 vis-à-vis 19.590 mt in April-August 2019 (20.26% decrease) and KDS handled 5.030 mt of cargo in April-August 2020 vis-à-vis 7.488 mt in April- August 2019 (32.83% decrease).

III. CONTAINER TRAFFIC:

SMP, Kolkata handled 2,51,830 TEUs (KDS: 1,97,146 & HDC: 54,684) during April-August 2020 vis-à-vis 3,61,376 TEUs (KDS: 2,86,217 TEUs & HDC: 75,159 TEUs) during April-August 2019, recording. a fall of 30.31%.

IV. SHIP TRAFFIC:

During April-August 2020, 1193 ships (KDS: 399, HDC: 794) called at SMP, Kolkata. 1576 vessels (794 inward; 782 outward) passed through Eden channel in April-August 2020 to / from Haldia.

V. RAILWAY TRAFFIC:

During April-August 2020, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 10.571 mt (KDS-1.856 mt & HDC-8.715 mt) against 12.122 mt (KDS-2.098 mt & HDC-10.024 mt) in April-August 2019. During April-August 2020, 437 trains were received and 441 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 1666 trains were received and 1645 were despatched.

VI. COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE:

- ➤ SMP, Kolkata ranked 5th among Major Ports in cargo handling during April-August 2020.
- The Port ranked 1st in Coking/Other Coal and 2nd in Other Liquids among Major Ports.
