#### II <u>CARGO THROUGHPUT</u>:

- SMP, Kolkata handled 43.269 million metric tonnes (MMT) of cargo during April -November, 2023 vis-à-vis 41.721 MMT during April-November, 2022, registering an increase of 3.71 %.
- HDC handled 31.847 MMT of cargo during April -November, 2023 vis-à-vis 30.878 MMT during April -November, 2022 (an increase of 3.14 %). KDS handled 11.422 MMT of cargo in April -November, 2023 vis-à-vis 10.843 MMT during April -November, 2022 (an increase of 5.34%).
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL (Product), Other Liquid, Vegetable Oil, Iron Ore, Other Coal / Coke (Incl. Petroleum Coke, Metallurgical Coke), Finished Fertilizer, Fertilizer Raw Materials, Fly Ash, Container TEUs etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Finished Fertilizer, Fertilizer Raw Materials, Fly Ash, Timber, Other Coal / Coke, Pulses & Peas, Container( both TEUs and Tonnage) etc. during April -November, 2023 vis-à-vis corresponding period of last year.

#### III <u>CONTAINER TRAFFIC</u>:

SMP, Kolkata handled 5,05,984 TEUs (KDS: 4,36,802 & HDC: 69,182) during April - November, 2023 vis-à-vis 4,49,827 TEUs (KDS: 3,82,645 & HDC: 67,182) during April - November, 2022, an increase of 12.48%.

#### IV <u>SHIP TRAFFIC</u>:

During April-November, 2023, 2175 ships (KDS: 838, HDC: 1337) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 1996 ships (KDS: 717, HDC: 1279) in the corresponding period of 2022, an increase of 8.97 %. 2674 vessels (1337 inward; 1337 outward) passed through Eden Channel during April-November, 2023 to / from Haldia vis-à-vis 2562 vessels (1279 inward; 1283 outward) during April-November, 2022.

#### V <u>COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE</u>:

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in handling of Coking/Other Coal, 2<sup>nd</sup> in handling of Other Liquids and 3<sup>rd</sup> in handling of Container TEUs, Finished Fertilizer & Other Miscellaneous Cargo amongst Indian Major Ports during April-November, 2023.

### VI <u>RAILWAY TRAFFIC</u> :

During April-November, 2023, SMP, Kolkata handled rail borne cargo of 22.457 MMT (HDC-18.931 MMT, KDS- 3.526 MMT) against 23.278 MMT (HDC-19.380 MMT, KDS- 3.898 MMT) in April-November, 2022. During April-November, 2023, 838 rakes were received and 840 dispatched at KDS; at HDC, 4231 rakes were received and 4221 were dispatched in the period under review.
