General Instructions to the candidates:

Call letters have been issued to the prima-facie eligible candidates both by speed post and also by e-mail. If the candidate does not receive Call letter by post, he/she may also take a print out of the e-mail (soft copy) of the Call letter and appear for the written test.
The candidate must bring the Call letters with recent passport size photograph affixed in the space provided and require at the time of appearing for the written examination. No candidate will be permitted to enter the examination Centre without the call letter.
The Call letters along with affixed passport size photograph will be collected in the examination hall and therefore the candidate is advised to keep one photocopy of the Call letters for her own reference.
Candidate must carry at least one photo bearing IDENTITY PROOF in original such as Passport, Driving License, Voter Card, Aadhaar Card, Identity Card issued by University / College, Pan Card <u>along with a self-certified photocopy</u> of the same, to the examination Centre, failing which, HE/SHE SHALL NOT BE ALLOWED TO APPEAR FOR THE EXAMINATION.
The candidate should reach the examination Centre / Venue at the reporting time. Late comers will not be permitted to appear in the test. They should bring 2 good quality BLACK/BLUE ball point pen for answering the test questions. Use of Pencils is strictly prohibited for answering questions.
Candidature for the test is provisional and subject to fulfilling all the eligibility conditions as indicated in the advertisement.
